Eighty-Four Million Miles of Telephone Wire in the United States

The number of miles of telephone wire in the United States figures up to nearly 84,000,000 miles. The Bell exchange wire mileage amounts to 63,379,000 miles, that for commercial telephone companies to 6,202,000 miles, and for non-exchange companies 139,000 miles, making a total exchange wire mileage of 69,581,000 miles. Added to this should be 14,500,000 miles of toll and long distance wire, which makes a total wire mileage of 84,081,000 miles. Of the toll mileage 60 per cent now is in underground cable, over 27 per cent in aerial cable, and less than seven per cent in open wire.
