"If the garnishment stands and plaintiff is allowed to collect his judgment the greater share of the districts, will not receive anything, as there will be nothing left in the Township Treasurer's hands for distribution. This will necessitate the closing of the schools in these various school districts for a considerable length of time. The Plaintiff in this case is not willing to accept its proportionate, share of the money held by the Township Treasurer, but insists on collecting its judgment in full.

"Section 14690 of the Compiled Laws of 1929 provides the method of collecting a judgment against a township, village or city. Section 14699 provides the insuance of bonds for payment of judgments against Townships, and the section following 14699 provides the method of collecting on those bonds. The statutory provisions have not been followed in this case, which in the opinion of the court apply, as the plaintiff is attempting in effect to collect a judgment by garnishment.
