This is to advise that it is proposed to construct and improve a road project M-663-27. Proposed new route of US16 from Farmington Road in the City of Farmington, NWly across sections 29, 29, and 30, 4 miles to 10 mile road, in Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan.
