## Exclude Village?

considered Quakertown as continuing to be part of the township, and the master plan shows the village as being a low-density residential area. The township considers Quakertown as a neighborhood in its Neighborhood Unit Plan, and future land use plans show Quakertown's development will continue as is after the township incorporates, Brennan added.

All of the subdivisions in Quakertown were developed when the area was not a village but part of the township, Brennan continued. Wood Creek built one subdivision (Wood Creek Hills) after it became a village, and it has smaller lot sizes than those platted earlier by the township, he added.

**ROBERT MCCONNELL**, Jettisoner and leader of the Future Farmington Association (FFA) promised both villages his group would campaign for a representative from each village for the charter commission.

David Calhoun, commission chairman, announced the public hearing on township incorporation will be held Dec. 2 in the North Farmington High School auditorium.

At that hearing, further consideration will be given Quakertown's exclusion request along with township incorporation and the City of Farmington's request for the five parcels.
