WELFARE COSTS INCREASE Lansing, Mich.—In caring for indigents, Michigan spent \$11,965,689 more for the year ending Sept. 30, 1931 than for the same period ending Sept. 30, 1930, according to compilation by the Department of State from annual reports to Superintendents of the Poor of Michigan's 83 counties. This compilation is required by law annually.

Almost all of the increased cost was due to unemployment.
