The play will be staged in the Liberal Arts Theatre on Thursday and Friday, Nov. 4 and 5, at 8 p.m., and Sunday, Nov. 7, at 7 p.m.

"A DOLL'S HOUSE," written in 1879, is being revived currently in various parts of the country, including the John F. Kennedy Center of

the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C.

Plot of the story centers around Nora Helmer, who lives a sheltered life with her father and later with her husband. She was not permitted to "acquire a broad education or even to master the elementary realities of the social world."

She committed forgery to obtain a loan with which she could save her husband's life. Because of the complications which ensued, Nora felt she needed to learn something about the world at large, and she could only accomplish this if she walked out on her husband Torvald and her children.

Osgood Is Chosen Festival Chairman

DEARBORN Richard E. (Dick) Osgood, of Farmington, veteran broadcaster and consultant to the Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village, has been named honorary chairman of the "Mary Pickford Film Festival: A Retrospective Tribute" to be presented at the Museum Theater from Nov. 5 through Dec. 5.

Prior to his association this year with Greenfield Village, Osgood was a movie reviewer for 35 years on radio and television, making him the dean of entertainment reporters in the Detroit area. Earlier in his career he was an actor on Broadway and in motion pictures during the 1920's.

Osgood's background as an authority, and his admiration for Mary Pickford's contribution to cinema history, led to his appointment.
