

## Ecology Group Listings Sought

Observer Newspapers is joining with the Comprehensive Health Planning Council of Southeastern Michigan (CHPC) and the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) in compiling a complete listing of all citizen groups in the region concerned with protecting the environment. Search for identity of these organizations and their special purposes was initiated last month by the CHPC as part of its overall planning program.

A 25-man environmental health planning committee of CHPC recognized that as a starting point it would need a listing of such organizations. None is presently available in the seven county region of Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Washtenaw and Wayne counties.

**HARRY F. BOYLE**, director of the bureau of sanitary engineering and chairman of the CHPC

committee, said SEMCOG staff efforts have identified 35 citizen and voluntary associations groups with expressed environmental concerns.

"We want to be thorough, however, and there are probably many we have not been able to identify despite extensive efforts," Boyle said. SEMCOG, a voluntary association of local governments in the seven county region, was asked to compile the listing because CHPC, now only one year old, lacks personnel and "we needed these first answers as quickly as possible," Boyle said.

When the inventory of organizations is completed, it will be published and made available throughout the region, Boyle said.

The CHPC Environmental Health Planning Committee then will assess the combination of programs, recommend or initiate activities where needed, and help coordinate all programs

to move toward a quality environment, Boyle said. Readers of this newspaper connected with a local group involved in protecting the

## 4 Docs In Family Like Soft Lens

"The new soft type contact lenses are the greatest thing to come along in the optical world in several years, and they fit eyes perfectly," commented Dr. William Greenberg, who shares offices at 3232 Warren Road in Westland with his father-in-law, Dr. Myron Hauser.

"We have been working with the new lens for several weeks, and our experience has been good. We don't have the same feeling of some specialists in our field who recommend waiting for a while to completely test the soft lenses."

"Our supplier was one of the first to put the new type on the market and only after years of tests. It is the feeling of myself and my associates, who include my wife, Dr. Joann Greenberg, and her parents, Drs. Myron and Pearl Hauser, that the lenses will not cause any discomfort."

"We have ordered numerous sets for patients, and every single one has nothing but high praise. The soft lenses curve around the eye, fit perfectly and don't seem to fall out as often as the hard types."

THE TWO husband and wife teams are a rarity in Michigan. Seldom does one hear of four registered optometrists in a single family...but that's the story of the Greenbergs and Hausers. The male members share the office in Westland, but Dr. Hauser also has an office in Detroit.

The female members have offices in Hamtramck and all are busy. Each office includes a waiting room, examining room and a visual training room.

It isn't unusual to find four optometrists in one family, but unusual to have four expert bridge players in a family...but it is a rarity to have four registered optometrists, all engaged professionally in their occupation.

The parents have been practicing for years, and their daughter decided to follow in their footsteps.

But when Joann married William Greenberg, the families decided it would be better for the men to join forces in offices and the feminine members to join up in another site.

The Hausers had offices in Hamtramck and Detroit and when the split came, the distaff pair took over in Hamtramck, Dr. Bill opened offices in Westland and Dr. Hauser is in Detroit part time and with his son-in-law part of the week.

This setup has been very

successful and now the quartet is working with the soft lenses and find they are being accepted by the majority of those seeking contact lenses.

"We can't miss," explains Dr. Bill Greenberg. "There are four of us, all dedicated to the same motto."

## Topic: Politics At Retail Center

The highly controversial issue of demonstrations on shopping center property will be one of the subjects under discussion during a day-long idea exchange seminar sponsored by the International Council of Shopping Centers.

Nov. 16, in the Pontchartrain Hotel in downtown Detroit. Stanley Winkelman, president of the Winkelman Co., will moderate a panel consisting of Ronald Regan and Averil Cohn, attorneys representing the American Civil Liberties Union.

Representing shopping center developers will be attorneys Milton M. Maddin of

Maddin & Maddin and Maurice S. Binkow of Honigman, Miller, Schwartz & Cohn. Maddin will speak for the Schostak Co. and Binkow for Forbes-Cohn.

THE RIGHT of demonstrators has been hotly contested by developers and civil libertarians since 1967, when a decision by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court ruled shopping centers quasi-public property.

The precedent-setting decision, though under appeal, has since formed the basis for argument by free-speech advocates throughout the country.

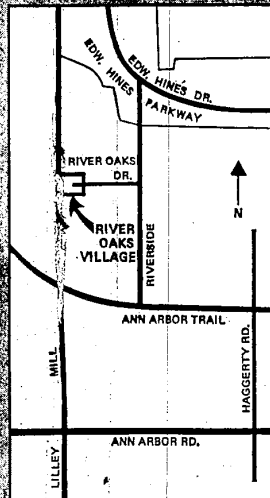
