Wage Freeze No Aid To SC

Any money saved by Schoolcraft College as a result of the wage-price freeze is quickly being soaked up by the state, according to trustee Leroy Bennett.

In discussing college finances at the Wednesday board meeting, Bennett pointed out that an up to three per cent reduction in state appropriations to the college will take \$72,339 from the budget. The wage price freeze has saved the college an estimated \$84,810 in salaries.

THE TOTAL financial picture of the college shows the budget was out of balance \$204,438 until adjustments were made.

It currently shows a \$67,428 imbalance, but college President C. Nelson Grote said the college has identified areas to make up more than half of the deficit without having to cut programs or services.

The original \$204,438 imbalance was the result of receiving \$27,000 less in state appropriations and \$50,000 less in federal grants than the college anticipated.

In addition, the college had

budgeted \$227,189 in reserves from the previous year's budget that were used by the 1970-71 budget. Plus \$72,339 can be cut from the state appropriation to the college.

Since the college received \$172,314 more in tuition and fees than expected, it was left with an imbalance of \$204,438. Currently, the administration hopes to be able to balance the budget in part with the \$84,810 in money saved by the freeze, \$39,200 saved by increasing teacher's loads under terms of the new appropriations act, and \$13,000 savings from the "maintenance optimization program."

College, Secretaries, In Pact

A tentative agreement was reportedly reached by the Schoolcraft College secretaries and administration this week.

Gerald Munro, chief negotiator for the administration, said that the Board of Trustees was informed of the agreement in an "executive" session Wednesday.

The board was informed that the secretaries will meet on Monday to vote on the agreement. If it is approved by the secretaries, the board will call a special meeting to consider ratification next Wednesday.

IF FINAL agreement is reached this week, it will conclude bargaining that began in May and resulted in a strike by the secretaries in August. The 50 members of the Schoolcraft College Association of Office Personnel (SCAOP) have been working without a contract since July 1.

They left their jobs over a stalemate in the talks and had resolved not to return to work until an agreement was reached.

However, the strike was cut short by President Nixon's wage price freeze, and the secretaries voluntarily returned to work after just four days on the picket line.

Two fact-finding sessions were held at the college with state fact-finder Alan Walt presiding. Walt's report was issued on Sept. 17 and has been the basis for recent negotiations.

LaRue Gets Board Duty

John LaRue was appointed parliamentarian of the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees last week.

The appointment was made in the first regular meeting of the board since five new trustees were elected to it on Sept. 13. LaRue was parliamentarian for the old board.

The new board also voted to defer action on appointments to a bylaws and policy subcommittee, the only active subcommittee to the board. Rosina Raymond and LeRoy Bennett expressed opinions that the entire board should serve on the committee, but final action was delayed.
