Mr. Bell is 25 years old, the son of S. O. Wylie Bell of Birmingham. Born in Birmingham he graduated from High School there completing his education at the University of Michigan and University of Michigan Medical School. For the past six years he has been associated with his father in business in Birmingham, being actively engaged during vacations and since graduation. Mr. Bell's father has been a funeral director in Birmingham for a great many years.

DEWITT C. DAVIS, Democratic Candidate for Coroner of Oakland County, Pontiac.

Due to being opposed on the Democratic ticket Mr. Davis' name will not appear on the Primary ballot.

ALBERT W. WILLSON, Republican Candidate for Re-election as Oakland County Treasurer, Pontiac.

F. in France. He is a member of the First Presbyterian church of Pontiac, the American Legion, Knights of Pythias and Masonic Lodge No. 21.

PERRY W. RICHWINE, Republican Candidate for Congress, 17th District, Plymouth.
"The practical experience which I have as an executive and legal counsel in one of Michigan's strongest building and loan associations, I believe, provides me with practical knowledge which will assist me in dealing with constructive banking and building and loan legislation. Such legislation, to prove useful to the people must be the fruit of all political influence. I believe that the payment of the soldiers' bonus should be made as soon as possible without jeopardizing the financial stability of our government. BERNARD F. (Bernie) SCHRAEDER, Democratic Candidate for Sheriff, Oakland County, Royal Oak.
"I appreciate the fact that there for a man schooled in management and familiar with the intricate details of the office of sheriff of Oakland County to reorganize and revise the timeworn methods and practices as well as eradicate and abolish much of the overhead and unnecessary expenditure that have long been a burden to the taxpayers. HENRY W. HARPSTER, Candidate for Judge of Probate, Oakland County, Pontiac.
"The purpose of the Juvenile court which is made a part of the Probate Court is to reform youth instead of to condemn them. All efforts should be made for the purpose of reformation. One of the functions of probate Court is to administer the estates of the deceased as they desired to be handled during their life time. My long legal and judicial experience, I believe will prove valuable in the proper functioning of this court. I have no affiliation with any factions, have never been connected with financial schemes, banks or syndicates to get rich quick, but have always advocated a straight business upon the plan that all men have equal rights under the law and special favors can not be given by an official in office without violating the trust for which he was elected."

Judge Harpster has had 48 years in the practise of law and 8 years as Judge of the Municipal Court of the City of Pontiac, was born and educated in Michigan and has lived in Pontiac 18 years.

VERNE C. HAMPTON, Republican Candidate for Circuit Court Commissioner, Oakland County, Pontiac.

"The Circuit Court Commissioner's duties consist of presiding over a court for the foreclosure of land contracts and disputes arising between landlord and tenant.
