Schulte Is Republican Candidate For Congress

John J. Schulte, Republican Candidate for Congress, 17th District, says:

"I believe in the strict enforcement of all laws on the statute books; in pushing vigorously to conclusion the Great Lakes Waterway project as a link to the Atlantic; that taxes should be kept, by judicious economy, to the lowest level commensurate with the growth of the United States.

"I strongly favor the immediate cash payment in full of the Soldier's Bonus certificates."

In regard to the Eighteenth Amendment, Judge Schulte says, "I think that the present law has brought corruption, bribery and many other manifold crimes in its wake; that it has generally brought disrespect for all laws; that State control, in some form, should be substituted therefore; that the 18th Amendment should be repealed, and the Volstead Act modified pending repeal."

Judge Schulte endorses the prosperity loan by the government to provide work for the unemployed, which will restore the purchasing power of the masses, so reviving employment through orders to factories and sale of raw materials by farms and mines.

He is opposed to any future moratorium and saddling Europe's war debts on the American taxpayers by foreign nations and the International Bankers.

Judge Schulte is of the City of Farmington, Oakland County, and is a taxpayer. He is a graduate of Central High School and the University of Detroit Law School. He is the municipal judge for the City of Farmington and the president of the Oakland County Citizens' League. Congressional Candidate Advocates Prohibition Repeal, Early Bonus Problem Settlement

William B. Rosevear, Jr. of Birmingham is an active candidate and is well known throughout the new 17th congressional district. His home is in the center of the district, consisting of Oakland County; Detroit west of Meyers Road; Livonia, Plymouth and Northville townships. Col. Rosevear was born in Saginaw, Michigan and attended public schools. Upon graduation from high school, he was appointed by Hon. Joseph W. Fordney to West Point and graduated in 1913. He served in the world war and was subsequently commissioned Colonel, Officers Reserve Corps at the age of 32, which commission he still holds. He favors repeal of the 18th amendment and the regulated sale of beer, wine and liquor. He stands for early and final settlement of all points of veterans' compensation so we can forget the war and proceed together for the common good. He has supplied all voters with full information and a complete, constructive program, with special emphasis upon economy and efficiency in government which can only be accomplished by elimination of numerous unessential activities that clog government machinery and create burdensome taxes.
