Patterson's Experience Cited As Qualification

Friends of Samuel J. Patterson, a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Probate Judge, state that during his 30 years of active law practice in Oakland County he has gained an extensive knowledge of the work of the Probate Court through special attention to the practice of the Court, the settlement and administration of estates, and the acting in the capacity of executor, administrator and trustee of many estates.

Mr. Patterson was born in Holly in 1874, a son of James K. and Martha Hadley Patterson. His father served as Oakland County Prosecutor in the late seventies. His father and mother died when he was a small boy and he went to live with an uncle, Thomas L. Patterson, of Holly.

He is a member of the Masonic fraternity, Pontiac Lodge of Elks, and active in the Kiwanis club.

His friends believe that he fully realizes the responsibilities connected with the probate office and is qualified to fulfill the requirements.

"Oakland County citizens are at the cross-roads, all are affected by existing conditions," Mr. Patterson says. "The taxpayers have the right to the whole-hearted cooperation of public officials in the effort to reduce heavy tax burdens. If elected, I pledge myself to economize in every possible way consistent with efficiency and good service."

"I shall not consider my election a personal victory, but rather a clear demand of the people for a new order of things, in harmony with present conditions; and will serve all of the people of the County to the best of my ability."

Allen Declares For 'Equal Chance For All'

That "all citizens should have an equal opportunity to public office and a few should not be selfishly enriched at the hands of the public" is the declaration of Lynn D. Allen, Republican candidate for County Clerk, who is making a vigorous campaign in every section of Oakland County. Allen, a World War veteran, an athlete of national reputation and a business-man, has put forward a platform which declares as above and further pledges him to "efficiency, economy and impartiality," unhampered "by entangling alliances" and "free from the domination of any clique or group."

Allen asserts that his opponent has received in the past single year, during four terms, approximately \$70,000 in salary and fees, and he declares that the time has arrived for a change in the office of County Clerk.

Allen, who is well-known for his welfare work, particularly among veterans, enlisted in the U. S. Navy at 19 while in college. There he had achieved an outstanding athletic career, having been a contender for All-American football honors. In the war served in the submarine destroyer fleet. He is a member of Cook-Nelson Post, No. 20, American Legion of Pontiac.

Allen is married and the father of two children, and lives in Pontiac.
