Action Vs. Promises

To the Citizens of the 17th Congressional District of Michigan: If you elect Franklin D. Roosevelt as President and John N. Garner as Vice-President, you should support them with co-operating Democratic Congressmen.

I believe in a reasonable and controlled inflation of the currency to maintain price levels.

I believe in legislation providing for guarantees by State and National Banks to protect savings deposits.

I believe that trustees or receivers for closed banks should be selected by the depositors.

I believe that milk should be declared a Public Utility with the price based upon the true cost of production.

I believe in the adoption of the Capper-Kelly Price Maintenance Measure.

I believe in a rigid investigation and prosecution by the Federal Trade Commission of milk combines, chain store systems, public utilities, and others that tend to monopoly in distribution.

I believe in the principle of Unemployment Insurance and Old Age Pensions.

I believe that the Federal Government should lead the way in bringing about a shorter working day and shorter working week, meanwhile maintaining for labor a saving wage.

I believe in strict enforcement of minor laws and the constant advancement of child welfare programs.

I believe in justice for all humanity, not for the chosen few, or for those who have acquired special privileges.

I believe in true representative government and I pledge to you if I am successful in this election I will not betray your trust.

Views Of Candidates
