**Ford Ahead Of All Competitors In Sales**

Notwithstanding the fact that the Ford Motor Company did not get into volume production of the new Ford V-8 car until June, Ford Sales in the state of Michigan during the first eight months of wide margin a spokesman for the Company said today.

Since June Ford has led all competitors in national sales of 1932 led all competitors by a passenger cars, commercial cars and trucks, according to official figures.

Total Ford passenger cars sales in Michigan for the year through August 31 were 17,096 or 34.2 per cent of the total of 50,000 cars of all makes officially registered in the period. This compared with a total of 12,066, or 24.1 per cent for its nearest competitor.

Ford passenger car sales in Wayne County for the same period totaled 10,715 or 33.9 per cent of the total of 27,295 cars of all makes registered, and compared with sales of 5,401, or 19.3 per cent for its nearest competitor.

Ford also led in sales of commercial cars and trucks. Its eight month total for the state was 2,035, or 44.1 per cent of the total of 4,611 for all makes, as compared with 1,471, or 31.9 per cent of its nearest competitor.
