he could save the city money on the job, in whatever way it was done.

Mayor Lamb said he did not believe it fair, since Mr. Zimmerman already knew what Mr. McAlpine's bid was. Mr. Zimmerman replied that he "paid no attention" to Mr. McAlpine's bid, and would do his own figuring without reference to it. He said that he would have his offer in, if there had been any notice that bids were to be received.

Mayor Lamb replied that he called the special meeting had not been called to receive the offer of anyone who cared to make one, but specifically to accept or reject Mr. McAlpine's bid. Another discussion ensued, in which Mr. Zimmerman criticized the Commission for not opening the field to other surveyors. "You know as well as I do that this whole thing could easily be upset," he declared, "Now if there is going to be any bidding done by anyone, we want to put out the bid in Mr. McAlpine's right to bid along with anyone else." He said he represents owners of several pieces of property in Farmington, and would soon have title to some himself.

Mayor Lamb stated that the Commission had considered the thing two or three years, with other surveyors from Plymouth and elsewhere putting the matter before the commission chamber, and that McAlpine's offer was the most reasonable that had been made. Mr. Zimmerman then declared that if it was desired, he and his associate would leave the commission chamber, and take later what action they saw fit. He denied any threat was implied.

A motion was then offered and passed unanimously to award the job to Mr. McAlpine.

Mr. McAlpine's offer gives him until July 1, 1934, instead of until May 15, 1933. He is to receive 750 in July of next year, and the remaining 750 in July 1934.

Besides making the eight plats and marking the lots, he is to provide a cloth-tape map, not less than 100 feet to the inch, showing location of all buildings in the city and of public utilities installed.

Mr. McAlpine told the Enterprise that the small portion in the worst shape would be done first, in time for the tax-roll next year.

Bandits who cut telephone wires, in an effort to make good their escape, after shooting Sheriff Hiles at Price, Utah, provided the authorities with valuable clues by so doing.

Winnona Metcalf, night telephone operator, was on duty about 2 o'clock one recent morning when she answered a signal from the sheriff's office. "Get the doctor quick! The sheriff's been shot!" was the message. She quickly notified the two deputy sheriffs, the marshal, and two doctors who found that the sheriff had been wounded with a shotgun. In an effort to catch the desperadoes, a number of sequence calls were placed to the sheriffs in Grand Junction, Green River, Salt Lake, Roosevelt and Richfield, as well as to the outlying towns.

While the operator was completing the call to Grand Junction, the line went out of line. Soon thereafter the Green River line and also two to Salt Lake City went dead.

When the bandits sought to make good their escape by cutting the wires, they did not realize that in so doing they were giving a very definite clue to the direction of their escape, nor that alternate telephone circuits could be used to spread the alarm.
