CIRCUIT COURT COMMISSIONER'S WORK IMPORTANT

Interest in all public affairs is keener than usual this year, as in all presidential campaigns, but a number of public-spirited Oakland County citizens are making a special effort to focus attention for the coming election on one of the least conspicuous, but nevertheless one of the most important offices in the County. The office is that of circuit court commissioner, one seldom in the public eye, but one which handles matters of the greatest moment to large numbers of citizens.

The circuit court commissioners, of which there are two in Oakland County, handle cases involving ownership and possession of land. However, the amount and the problems before them often involve as much as do cases before the circuit judges themselves.

Because the office is one of this nature, men and women in various parts of the County are active in urging the continuance of a circuit court commissioner of Earl L. Phillips, of Pontiac. At first public office, Mr. Phillips, they point out, has shown to an exceptional degree the sound judgment, the thorough legal experience and the high integrity which the position demands.

His standing as an attorney and as a public official is of the highest. Mr. Phillips is one of the best-known members of the Oakland County bar, having been a practicing attorney in Pontiac for 15 years. He is a Republican.

Election Revision of 1931—No. 410—Chapter VIII.

Sec. 1. On the day of any election the polls shall be opened at seven o'clock in the forenoon, and shall be continued open until six o'clock in the afternoon and no longer: PROVIDED, That in townships the board of inspectors of election may, in its discretion, adjourn the polls at twelve o'clock noon, for one hour, and that the township board of townships, and the legislative body in cities and villages may, by resolution, provide that the polls shall be opened at six o'clock in the forenoon, and may provide that the polls shall be kept open not later than eight o'clock in the evening of the same day. Every qualified elector present and in line at the polls at the hour prescribed for the closing thereof shall be allowed to vote.

The Polls of said Election will be open at 7 o'clock a. m. and will remain open until 8 o'clock p. m., Eastern Standard Time, on said day of Election.
