

Marijuana Dangers: 'Fantasies'

The real dangers of marijuana are the "fantasies" connected with it, according to Robert Moorman, a former colleague of LSD advocate Timothy Leary.

Moorman, whose six years of drug experimenting landed him in jail, told a Schoolcraft lecture series audience last week that better drug education is needed.

He criticized many present drug education programs that use scare tactics and spread "fantasies" about drugs.

"PROBABLY the most damaging statement I've ever heard in drug education is that marijuana leads to heroin," Moorman said.

"They get these 'facts' from surveys of drug addicts in hospitals, and they (the addicts) say they had smoked marijuana before they tried heroin. It's like interviewing alcoholics and concluding that since they first drank milk, milk leads to alcoholism."

Moorman said he had given up drugs and now used meditation as his "escape from reality," but realized that this was not "everybody's thing."

"The real answer to drugs is to give some alternatives," he said, criticizing "society" for steering youths towards drugs.

"You've been conditioned to pills all your life," the former drug user said. "The TV ads promise you instant relief from your problems just by taking a little pill. You see that from the time you're a little kid."

MOORMAN PASSED up the speaker's rostrum and paced the floor during his speech, using exaggerated gestures to mock some habits of drug users. He recounted several humorous tales from his drug-use days in an Arlo Guthrie type narrative, complete with a Southern twang.

One real threat from marijuana is its illegality, Moorman said. Marijuana users are forced to go "underground" where they encounter an entirely different kind of society that often pressures them into using harder drugs, he said.

These laws hamper research on marijuana, Moorman said. "Hello sir," he said mimicking a drug researcher in a man-on-the-street interview, "have you ever experimented with marijuana? Yes? All right buddy, come with me down to the (police) station."

Moorman said that if marijuana was legalized, many people from different walks of life would surface as long-time pot-users.
