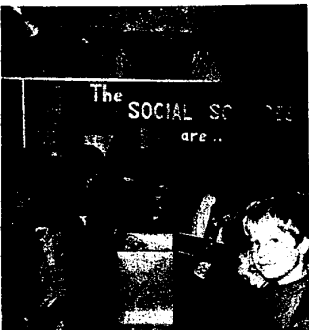


Capsule Tells 'Who We Are'

Clarenceville has buried its own time capsule. Rather fifth graders of Mrs. Shirley Pretzlaff at Grandview Elementary School, 19814 Louise, Livonia have buried one.

The students, as a result of a social studies discussion and recent study of prehistoric man, felt it important for future scientists to have knowledge of life in the 20th century. Students also have been observing ways in which scientists use pictures and artifacts to reconstruct ways in which people of the past lived and worked.

AS A RESULT, the students created and selected materials to bury in the capsule which they hope will represent a cross section of the world of 1971.

The class' main effort was directed toward a class

constructed "Book of Our Life." Sixteen chapters were crammed with pictures from newspapers, magazines and catalogues, all dealing with present-day institutions and daily activities.

Chapter titles ranged from "Who We Are," "How We Dress," and "How We Work" to "How We Govern Ourselves." A dedication in the front of the book, written by two students, will relate to future discoverers who planted the capsule and why.

In addition to the book, capsule contents include a dictionary to serve as a guide to our language and an atlas to show present locations, place names and political divisions. Students also provided many small articles of use in our daily lives which they thought would be of interest to later generations.

THE BOOKS and articles were securely tied in plastic which was placed in an insulated aluminum box. The box was sealed with a caulking compound to make it watertight. Students then dug a three-foot hole in the school grounds to bury the capsule.

Attending the burying ceremony were the fifth graders, their teacher and pre-interim teacher, Stan Wigodski. Principal A. J. LaBarge spoke on the significance of the capsule. Pictures of the event were taken by the class photographer, and location of the capsule was charted on a map by two students and presented to Principal LaBarge for school files.
