Pupils Still Achieving

In vocabulary, 90th this year and 85th last year; in reading, 85th this year and 82nd last year; in English expression, 85th this year and 83rd last year; and in mathematics, 85th this year and 84th last year.

Among seventh graders over the state, Farmington ranked at the 95th percentile in vocabulary, 90th in reading, 83rd in writing skills and 89th in mathematics for an overall 88 in academic achievement.

Farmington fourth graders ranked in vocabulary at the 89th percentile this year compared with the 90th last among "urban fringe" schools. They rated at the 75th percentile this year in reading compared with 76th last, at the 70th in writing skills this year and 69th last, and at the 81st in mathematics this year and at the 79th last in the urban fringe.

Ranked among Michigan schools statewide, the fourth graders were at the 91st percentile this year and 94th last, at the 75th in reading this year and 82nd last, at the 78th in writing skills this year and 74th last, and at the 82nd in mathematics this year and 84th last.
