EDITORIAL SPOTLIGHT

A NEWSPAPER'S VIEW—Newburyport, Mass., Daily News

One of the most difficult experiences of a period when it has been necessary to practice supreme economy is the sacrifice of the telephone. Surprisingly large numbers of people here have ordered their phones disconnected although orders are now flooding in to have the service resumed, as people return to work. The person who has never known the convenience of having a telephone in his home does not sense a dependence upon the service, but to relinquish it after enjoying the telephone for years is an unpleasant experience, indeed. We are accustomed to relying on the telephone for help in case of emergency. The telephone has probably saved countless thousands in averting fire losses, when a few minutes, following the discovery of a fire, makes worlds of difference. To be able to summon a doctor without delay is productive of a sense of security. These are but two of the emergencies in which the telephone is a reliable servant. In considering household retrenchment, removal of the telephone is the last sacrifice to be encountered and replacing of the installation is one of the first tasks ordered when one gets back to work.

CHANGE IN DOG LICENSE

House enrolled Act No. 73, amending Act No. 339 of the Public Acts of 1919, providing for the licensing of dogs, was ordered to take immediate effect and provided for a reduction of license fee. Individuals interested in this law can secure information from the County Clerk, to whom copies of the amendment have been forwarded.
