

Swimmers Earn \$2,450 For FHS

FARMINGTON Farmington swimmers earned nearly \$3,500 in the benefit swim-a-thon held to raise funds for the AAUW and purchase uniforms for Farmington Senior High swimmers.

Leading swimmers in the swim-a-thon were: Jenny Pardonnet, 200 lengths for \$200; Amy DeVriendt, 200 lengths for \$172; Karen Stewart, 200

lengths for \$141; and Nancy Pardonnet earned \$129.

The average amount paid per length was 33 cents and participants swam a total of 148 miles. (One mile is 70 lengths of the 25-yard FHS pool.)

Swimmers participating in the marathon lined up sponsors who paid any amount they wished for each length swam by the athlete they sponsored.

Each swimmer was limited to a maximum of one continuous two-hour period in the water or a maximum of 200 lengths.

Seventy per cent of the \$3,500, or \$2,450, went to FHS to purchase a record board and warmup jackets. Another 20 per cent will be used to furnish a world swimming library and museum at the Hall of Fame, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., and the remaining 10 per cent is divided among the U.S. International Swimming Fund, regional, state and local leagues administering the swim program.

STATE BOUNDARY COMMISSION TO CONDUCT PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED INCORPORATION OF FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP, VILLAGE OF QUAKERTOWN AND VILLAGE OF WOOD CREEK FARMS, OAKLAND COUNTY, INTO A HOME RULE CITY, DECEMBER 2, 1971

To comply with section 8 of Act 151 of the Public Acts of 1968, being section 123.1108 of the Compiled Laws of 1946, the State Boundary Commission will hold a public hearing on the proposed incorporation of Farmington Township, Village of Quakertown and Village of Wood Creek Farms into a new home rule city, and will receive information and testimony on the following:

1. Population;
2. Population density;
3. Land area;
4. Land use;
5. Assessed valuation;
6. Topography;
7. Natural boundaries and drainage basins;
8. Past and probable future urban growth, including population increase and business, commercial and industrial development in the area;
9. Comparative data for the incorporating municipality, and the remaining portion of the unit from which the area will be detached shall be considered;
10. Need for organized community services;
11. Present cost and adequacy of governmental services in the area to be incorporated;
12. The probable future needs for services;
13. Practicability of supplying such services in the area to be annexed;
14. Probable effect of the proposed incorporation and of alternative courses of action on the cost and adequacy of services in the area to be incorporated and on the remaining portion of the unit from which the area will be detached;
15. Probable increase in taxes in the area to be incorporated in relation to the benefits expected to accrue from incorporation;
16. Financial ability of the annexing municipality to maintain urban type services in the area;
17. General effect upon the entire community of the proposed action;
18. Relationship of the proposed action to any established city, village, township, county or regional land use plan.

The Boundary Commission will not reach any conclusions or make any determinations until after December 2, 1971, public hearing. The Commission has several options available. They can deny the petition, approve it as submitted or approve it with boundary adjustments.
