

even city. The city contends the five parcels would square off its boundaries and provide room for future growth while having little significant effect on the township's tax base.

Of the five parcels, three are sparsely populated and could be annexed to the city by commission action without an election. The other two parcels are more heavily populated and, by state law, would require an annexation election.
