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Court of Appeals ruling against consolidation. Ellsworth added that the MSU study states the minimum population for a city is 3,000 persons and Quakertown has only 1,100 and fails to meet other criteria for cityhood.

He continued that in the past few years the per capita revenue of Quakertown has decreased while per capita expenditures have increased. If Quakertown does not join Farmington Hills, Ellsworth said, it will have nothing to say about what develops around its borders.
