Raiders Surprise All In 71-59 Harrison Win

North Farmington surprised everyone including Coach Ken Dean in its cage opener with Farmington Harrison. The Raiders outscored Harrison in every quarter to capture a 71-59 verdict.

"I was up in a cloud after the game," said Dean. "They just might come around this year with our green team."

North Farmington has only two returning players from last year's squad and they played a total of about four quarters.

"We committed only nine fouls and they didn't shoot one-on-one till the final stages of the game," said Dean.

HARRISON committed 19 fouls and North was 15 for 22 from the line while Harrison was only one for eight.

Harrison outshot North Farmington by 20 from the field but hit only 29 times on 77 attempts for a 38 per cent while North connected on 28 of 57 for a 49 per cent.

"Everything just went our way," said Dean.

HARRISON COACH BOB SUTTER commented, "We thought we could run against North but they kept our big men off the boards and the zone defense caused us to shoot from the outside and we just couldn't get it in."

"They got a few points up on

us and we just couldn't catch them," added Sutter.

Raider Kim Parker tossed in two freethrows to open the game and North jumped to a 16-12 first quarter lead. The Raiders fell behind 24-17 in the second quarter with a full-court press getting the best of them.

Dean called timeout and regrouped his offensive attack and the Raiders bounced back in the second half of the period outscoring Harrison 17-4 in four minutes.

NORTH outscored the Hawks 20-19 in the third quarter and 17-12 in the fourth to wrap up its win.

Harrison's 6-7 center, Jeff

Sieloff was forced to play with a plastic mask due to a broken nose occurred in an early season scrimmage with Ann Arbor Pioneer.

"I believe the mask worked against Sieloff," said Sutter. "He was hesitant to really get in there and fight for the ball."

Parker was the game's high scorer with 21 for North with Fred Neighten and Louie Doot scoring 16 and 11 respectively for the Raiders.

JOE DOA and Jim Mason shared honors for Harrison with 18 points each.
