## Drake May Get Asphalt

The City of Farmington was unable to pave Drake Road in 1971 but may schedule improvements which could be completed by mid-summer of next year.

The city council Monday night instructed City Manager John Dinan to begin a study on providing deep-strength asphalt on Drake between the spring work beginning in the spring.

THE CITY had included Drake in its 1971 major road paving program but dropped the project when the price hit \$175,000 and the state refused to classify Drake as a major road.

By using asphalt instead of

concrete with curbs and gutters, Dinan told councilmen, the cost of improvement could be reduced by 50 per cent.

Dinan admitted that Drake should be classified as a local road because of its low traffic volume. Because it is a local road, the city manager added, the cost of the 23-foot asphalt roadway would be financed by special assessment.

IF FUTURE traffic counts warranted improvements, Dinan suggested, the roadway could be widened to 33 feet with curbs and gutters added. Councilmen John Allen and John Richardson agreed with Dinan that seven-inch deep asphalt would be sufficient for Drake and both voiced agreement the improvement was needed.

Dinan said he could prepare a cost estimate for the Dec. 20 meeting and there would be time to hold the necessary public hearings for work to begin in the spring. He also said he would check with Oakland County Road Commission and Farmington Township to see if an agreement could be worked out to pave the 580 feet of Drake in the township between the city limits and 8 Mile.
