His Last Message

"Dear Mr. Levinson: "Nearly seventy-two years ago September 4, 1862, ten school boys attending the old "Baptist Church School" in what is now termed West Farmington, marched down Saginaw Street in Pontiac in response to President Lincoln's call to save the Union. Jesse Sage, Henry Moore, Charley Wicand, Sibly Sage, Ralph Willer, Will Seaton, Henry Knapp, Hudson Wilcox and myself. "Hue and I were barely seventeen. I've lie in South- four graves. Six of us returned home in July 1865. Just three years after we volunteered to help save.

"Few if any other country schools made a better showing in the four-year-war to defeat secession. Today I am the only one left. August 31st six or seven comrades of the old 22nd Michigan will meet in Pontiac to hold our regiment's annual reunion. It's 72th since returning in 1865. Only a half dozen out of 1,000 who marched away with us seventy-two years ago. A lapse of over 70 years has failed to obliterate names and faces of those old school mates who gave up home, brothers and sisters to make long
