SERVICE STATION MECHANICS ABOUT TO BE RECOGNIZED

The skilled service station mechanic is about to spain the recognition he has so long deserved. That is, Chevrolet's mechanics are—for the Chevrolet Motor Company is about to put into erfect a nation-wide plan for awarding special master mechanic badges to those qualified.

COUR CHILD AND THE SCHOOL

A Code for Child Health
While the industrial codes we read shout may come and go, be rought of the code for child health will always. be a code for child health will always. be a code for child health will always. be a to requisite of successful parenthood. Let us review the elements out of which auch a code should be made.

I believe most parents would list first: the quart of milk daily, taken in different forms; two or more vegetables, with at least one the green leafy variety daily; some, fresh fruit; meet fish and eggs; and bread and butter.

The amount of sleep is impor-tant; restful, quiet sleep. The young child should have an after-noon rest in addition. Fresh air and sunshine must be in the health budget in liberal allotments. And the diminished sunshine of winter calls for one of the fish liver oils as a regular item in the code.

Be sure that the child's right to playtime is honored. Let nothing interfere with this natural heritage. Permit some time every day when the child may do as he considered the examination, by our family physician and dentist. Insure against smallpox and diphtheria. There are the routine daily health habits such as cleanliness and elimination to be added to the code. Finally do everything possible to bring happiness to the child and to make him feel secure and safe. Give him companionably; laugh with him; encourage his confidences.


