TRUSTEE David Stader commented that the township had to build a station because of the State Control property sale and any delay would result in rising costs.

Motion was made by Mrs. Margaret Schaeffer, supported by Clerk Floyd Cairns, that the township accept the gift of the land and, after obtaining a clear title, proceed with site development with initial expenditures limited to \$15,000.

The board also voted to spend \$3,000 to renovate the lobby area in the township police station. Improvements will also be made in the records bureau, communications center and shift command area.

Holko was also given permission to hire a radio dispatcher and was instructed by the board to give clothing allowances to uniformed female police employees.

Griffin, a vice president of the S.S. Kresge Co. of Detroit, was one of 162 senior executives completing the 13-week management program.


2 In Concert
