NAAP IN ACTION

The narcotics analysis program of Farmington Township Police Department has been renamed Narcotic Analysis Anonymous Program (NAAP). Parents finding materials at home suspected to be narcotics may bring the material to the township police station for analysis. The parent is assigned a number and is not asked his name or address. Within 30 days, the parent can return to the station and receive the analysis at no cost.
