

Harrison Scalps Farmington For First Win

Lekovich scored with five seconds remaining in the quarter to put Farmington down by one, but Jim Mason of Harrison concluded the first quarter scoring on a toss from half court at the buzzer to put the Hawks up, 18-15.

Farmington came close to Harrison several times within one point, yet the Falcons couldn't put the ball in for a

score and Harrison led at the half, 28-23.

SIELOFF and Mason opened the scoring for Harrison the second half, and the Hawks held a 38-33 lead midway through the third quarter.

Freebairn Scores 34 Country Day Cagers Win

Country Day jumped to an early lead in its second basketball game, dropped behind in the third quarter but came on strong in the fourth to win its second game of the season, 69-63, over Holy Rosary.

Scott Freebairn, 6-4 guard, popped in 34 points for Country Day and collected 12 rebounds in the winning effort.

COUNTRY DAY enjoyed an early eight point lead but Rosary came back in the first quarter to narrow the score to 20-15. Holy Rosary outscored Country Day, 18-17, in the second quarter but Day held a

37-33 halftime lead with Freebairn scoring 16 points the first half.

Rosary spurted to a five-point lead in the third quarter and outscored Country Day, 18-9, to take a 51-46 lead.

With 2 1/2 minutes remaining in the game, Rosary was up 61-54, but Country Day outscored Rosary, 15-2, in the final minutes.

"Everything went right for

us, and everything went wrong for them," said Country Day Coach John Hannett. "We zone pressed them and they committed five turnovers."

COUNTRY DAY hit on 25 of 69 from the floor and 19 of 26 from the line while Holy Rosary went 17 of 32 from the line.

Country Day plays Harper Woods at home on Jan. 4.
