## Perishables Will Be Open-Dated

The Kroger Co. has an-nounced it will open-date some 1,300 perishable food products packed under its private labels.

Announcement decision was made in Milwaukee at a conference for Milwaukee at a conference for consumer group leaders sponsored by the Center for Consumer Affairs of the University of Wisconsin Extension and the Community Nutrition Institute of Washington, D.C.

Theodore Engel, Kroger Theodore Engel, Kroger Food Stores vice president, said the date will indicate the final day on which the product may be offered for sale. This 'pull' or final sale date is designed to allow the product to be at high quality at least for an average usage period in the customer's home after purchase.

purchase.

The program is being implemented immediately, Engel said, starting with weiners and luncheon meats, refrigerated biscuits, eggs, and margarine. By the end of 1972, he explained, 1,300 private brand perishable and semi-perishable food products packed in Kroger's own processing plants or by outside manufacturers will be open-dated.

Kroger private label food products are sold in the company's 1,400 super-markets in 20 midwestern and southern states.
