work with Dorian and learn fundamentals of the office. Motion to appoint Deadman to serve until a permanent city manager is named was made by Fred Seibert, supported by John Allen, and passed 5-0.

**DEADMAN**, 36, started police work in the City of Farmington 14 years ago when he was 22 years old and has been director since 1966. Before being named director, Deadman was in charge of the traffic safety and has served in the department as shift commander, youth officer and public safety officer.

Born in Boyne City, his tenure as public safety director has been highlighted by use of federal grants to expand the department and add modern law enforcement techniques. The two most recent grants have provided an upgraded traffic safety bureau and a modern communications system.

Born in Boyne City, Deadman moved to Detroit at age five when his father was attracted by the \$5 a day jobs offered by Henry Ford. He was educated in Detroit at Guest School and graduated from Cooley High School.

Deadman graduated from the police administration program at Oakland Community College, has studied at the Walsh Institute of Accounting and is now taking a course in police administration at Wayne State University. He has also taken management oriented courses at University of Michigan and Michigan State University.

Deadman has or does belong to the following community groups: Farmington Youth Assistance (formerly Youth Guidance Committee);

Rotary Club of Farmington; Farmington YMCA board of directors; Farmington Area Advisory Council board of directors; and a member of the Family Life Education citizens advisory committee on substance abuse.

His police background includes: member traffic safety committee of Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police; headed the committee which brought uniform crime reporting to Michigan; and chairman of the committee which developed the South Oakland County tactical support unit.

Deadman is married, has three children, and lives on Maple St. in the city. His wife Virginia is a senior at Eastern Michigan University, where she is majoring in business education.
