# Council Acts On Annexation

**FARMINGTON**

Annexation of two Farmington Township parcels was requested by resolution of the Farmington City Council Monday night.

The two parcels are among the five the city had requested in hearings before the State Boundary Commission.

That informal request was followed up by petitions from property owners in each area asking to be attached to the city. The petitions were presented at the Boundary Commission's recent public hearing in North Farmington High School.

**THE REQUEST** to the commission by council resolution was a formally recommended by City Manager John Dinan after Commission Chairman David Calhoun informally told a city official that annexation of low populated areas could be requested by resolution.

One area is the triangle between I-96 and the city limits to the north and from Gill Rd. to a point west of Drake.

The second is a triangle starting at the intersection of Grand River and I-96 and proceeding west to the city limits west of Nine Mile, with I-96 and Grand River as the north-south boundaries.

Each area has fewer than 100 persons and may be annexed to the city without an election by the commission, either at the time an incorporation election date is set for the proposed City of Farmington or later.

The two parcels comprise a total of about 192 acres, says Dinan. They would square off the city boundaries and afford proper municipal utilities and services to these residents.

**THE COUNCIL** heard an appeal from the Landmark restaurant which wanted to build at the corner of Mayfield and Grand River. The planning commission had recommended denial of the site plan because of traffic congestion and safety problems.

The developer appeared before the council with a presentation from its own traffic consultant, who argued location of the restaurant would have a negligible effect on Grand River traffic.

The family-style, sit-down restaurant would operate for 24 hours although the manager promised to change the hours if the city received complaints or if the hours of operation proved economically unfeasible.

The council agreed to make a final decision at its Jan. 17 meeting and instructed the developer to appear before the planning commission at its next meeting with the revised site plan and traffic study.
