(Continued from Page 1) supplying of vowels in the Hebrew text. What difference does it make whether the old Jewish patriarch Jacob, died of a heart or a lung attack on his staff or on his bed?

We of the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty-five years after the birth of the Christ the question has been as to just what books should be included in the inspired word of God.

Due to the rapid developments of the arts and sciences since the invention of the printing press in Germany in 1450 there have been repeated revisions in the understanding and translations of the older Latin and Greek texts so that today there are those who prefer the so-called authorized version prepared by 54 men of special learning who translated and edited the King James Bible in 1611.

Regardless of text or version the greatest blessing of this rule and guide of the faith of millions is that which is felt in human lives everywhere on the face of the globe.

What law giver in history has ever succeeded in improving on the laws of man's relation with man and his Maker as codified by the immortal Moses? What part of any of the civilizations of man has equalled the songs of David and especially that matchless gem of all literature "The Lord is my Shepherd, I will not want, He maketh me to lie down in green pastures; He leadeth me beside the still waters, He restoreth my soul; He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

When printed, word can be found summed-up so completely the whole scheme of life and the ultimate solution of its problems as that stated by the Master, when he gave the answer to the query of the scribes "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul and with all thy mind."

best and richest gift to man. May I again quote my pastor and friend. "The great question that comes home to everyone of us is this: What does this great book mean to me? God means it to be a guide for every time of perplexity, a strength for every hour of weakness. It has been a subject of tremendous controversy, but its value has only been increased by every storm that has raged around it. It is a human book, but its very fallibilities are as it were, stormclouds through which the sun of God's truth shines in human souls."

So as we in Michigan join with others in thankfulness for this most precious of the literature of the world; that gift of Almighty God through the pen of men inspired by an understanding of His ways, may I use the words of our great preacher, Dr. James L. Vance, a brother of him from whom I have so freely taken. "As long as men sin and suffer and die, the Bible will be one book for all people. All men long for life. All sigh for happiness. All yearn for love. To the thirsty soul whether in an American city or an African jungle, the Bible offers one who says, 'I am come that ye might have life and find it might have it more abundantly.' To the soul that longs to be happy, it offers one who says, 'Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you.' To the heart weary and lonely it offers one who says, 'The world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. As long as men cry for life and peace, and love, and joy, and hope, one book for all people. At the heart of all that is precious in our religion is the old Book, and we grope in the dark when we are blind to that which God has given to be a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path."

WPA REPLACES DOLE; AFFECTS OVER 300,000

When Thanksgiving arrived Thursday morning in Michigan, work and wages provided by the WPA had replaced the dole as means of sustenance for more than 300,000 men, women and children.

In a pre-holiday push, the State Works Progress Administration created enough jobs to take care of all available family heads in a majority of the counties, and smaller cities. Approximately 1,000 projects are now in operation, with others being started daily.

The rapidity with which WPA is summing workers from relief has made it impossible to determine the exact number now employed, but State Administrator Harry L. Pierson estimated that at least 85,000 men and women are on the government pay roll or under call for jobs.

In Lansing, Detroit and other key points, administrative heads have been working Saturdays and Sundays to clear the state's welfare lists of employable before December 1 when the government will end direct relief for families that include able-bodied men and women.

Wayne County, carrying the heaviest relief load in the state, has provided jobs for 25,000 of the 27,000 employables believed to be eligible for WPA work. With five large projects opening, 7,700 men were placed on call for employment this week. At the same time 600 women with dependents were to report for work.

Exclusive of a state-wide sewing program which got under way Monday with 2,000 wives and mothers participating, 56 projects for women are in operation in 20 counties. These consist of book mending, Braille transcription, health surveys, recreational direction and the manufacture of garments and surgical dressings.

Before the end of the month the Women's Division of the WPA will have sufficient work in progress to place 5,000 family providers, all that are listed in the state by relief agencies. Materials for the sewing project are now available in each of the eight WPA districts in Michigan. Textiles supplied by Washington will be converted into dresses, blouses, underwear and household linen for distribution among welfare families in which there are no employables.
