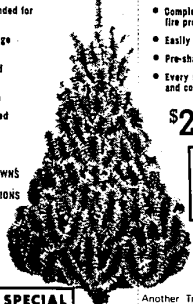

Laws Give State Total Ownership Of All Wildlife

Under the common law of England, the ruling monarch was the owner of all wildlife found within the territorial limits of his realm subject to such restrictions as might be imposed by Parliament.

The net result of this development of the law was that when the English colonies were formed on the North American continent, they inherited the same rights as were exercised by the King and Parliament of England and, therefore, upon the end of the Revolutionary War, the 13 colonies succeeded to these rights.

It is because of this historical background that the United States Supreme Court held that the states are the owners of game and fish and thus have plenary and absolute authority over its use, possession and disposition.

IN FACT, Michigan's game and fish statutes specifically state that all game and fish found in this state is the property of the state and may be taken, possessed and disposed of only as permitted by law.

One of the basic tenets of the doctrine is that wildlife, being owned by the state, is separate from the ownership of the land itself.

This means that all land owners, irrespective of how they acquired title to property, do not own the game or fish found on their land or the water and such land owners must also comply with state laws with respect to the taking of wildlife which may be found on their lands.

It is important that the State of Michigan should own its fish and wildlife because:

1-In order to do an adequate job of management it has to have the power as an owner.

2-The state spends millions of dollars annually to do the things that are necessary to assure that the people will have an adequate supply of wildlife to hunt, to fish, or to take.

3-The state has planted by stocking many of the species of game and fish which are now prevalent. For instance, the elk and the pheasant were not indigenous to Michigan but were planted by the state many years ago.

The most recent planting was the coho salmon which has recently received such notoriety; in fact, the Conservation Department is currently planning a multi-million dollar coho salmon and chinook coloring program.

It is as a result of this basic doctrine that your state can manage and control fish and wildlife in such a way that it will be available not only to the people of the State of Michigan for their enjoyment, but also to the tourists who come here to enjoy our out-of-doors.
