Admission will be \$2 per person; \$1 for OCC students; and \$4 for families.

Also in the amphitheatre will be the rock concert series to be held Wednesday evenings. The Premiers will be featured July 14; Julla and Broken Crow, July 21; Black Pomojas, July 28; and Tea and Armada, Aug. 1.

The rock concerts will begin at 8 p.m. and admission again will be \$2 and \$1.

Classic comedy films will be shown Thursday evenings, at 8 p.m. in Room 294, J Building. July 5 Buster Keaton's "The Great Chase" will be shown. This will be followed by five movies July 22, "The Paleface" with Keaton, "The Fireman" and "The Floorwalker" with Charlie Chaplin; "Two Tars," starring Laurel and Hardy; and "Pool Sharks," with W.C. Fields. Alex Guinness will be seen in "Our Man in Havana" July 29, and the Marx Brothers classic "A Night at the Opera" will be shown Aug. 5. Admission to the films is 75 cents for the public. They are free to OCC students.

THE THREE one-act plays will be shown every Friday evening through Aug. 6.

"Interview," produced by the Orchard Ridge Theatre Guild, is being directed by Deborah Walker, a second year student at the college. Appearing in the student production are Fran Goldberg, Tom Millman, Brian Krist, Mike Sutherland, Jim Wideman, Mary Shoemaker, Guy Veyver, Lorie Thurlow, Amy Naslund and Peggy Muller.

"Interview" is being accompanied by two professional productions, "Sarah and the Sax" stars Beverly Markowitz and Raymond Adams, and Mack Palmer and Wallace Smith appear in "The Zoo Story." Miss Markowitz, who makes her home in Southfield, has appeared in New York and Detroit as well as with several stock companies. Adams has appeared locally with the Concept East Theatre and at the Wayne State University's Hilbery Theatre. Palmer, in his 25 years in the theatre, has appeared with many companies.
