Voters Favor Drug Reform

Observerland residents showed cohesiveness on concern over drug problems in their answers to a questionnaire mailed to residents of the 19th congressional district by Congressman Jack McDonald (R-Farmington).

Residents of Farmington, Livonia and Redford Township expressed approval of a bill co-sponsored by McDonald that would halt military and economic assistance to foreign countries who fail to take steps to prevent narcotics from being produced or processed and shipped to the United States unlawfully.

Ninety-one per cent of persons answering the fifth annual questionnaire favored the bill and 99 per cent favored some reform in the welfare system.

Results showed that the constituency view crime, education, and pollution

respectively as domestic priorities needing attention by Congress.

More than one-third favored the president's Vietnamization program in Southeast Asia and 29 per cent favored a specific date for withdrawal. Twenty-four per cent indicated they would favor immediate withdrawal from Vietnam while 12.5 per cent called for a military victory.

On the draft question, 53 per cent favored abolition of the draft and the establishment of an all-volunteer army.

More than half—or 53 per cent—of the respondents opposed setting a pollution tax to aid in cleaning up the environment but 61 per cent of the 18 to 21-year-olds supported the tax.

"Most of the comments on this particular question alluded to making polluters pay extra taxes," McDonald said.

Expansion Plans OK'd By S'craft

College enrollments are up and Schoolcraft College facilities are remaining the same.

For this reason, the college's new president, Dr. C. Nelson Grote, asked the board of trustees for immediate approval of construction plans that will give the college the space it anticipates needing by September of 1972.

"We have some building problems that simply can't be delayed," Dr. Grote advised the board.

The administration submitted a main recommendation and two alternatives to the board of trustees. After some discussion, the board adopted the recommendations.

THE PLANS as adopted would permit the purchasing of five temporary units for \$50,000 that would be available for classrooms and office space by September 1972.

Another \$50,000 would be

allocated for architect's fees to develop final plans and bid documents for a 22,000 square foot addition to the Vocational Technical Building, scheduled for completion in September 1973.

The final two recommendations adopted by the board depend upon whether the one mill tax hike it is seeking in a Sept. 13 election passes.

If the millage passes, the college would immediately apply for state construction funds of up to 50 per cent of projected costs on the Fine Arts Building and the vocational-technical addition.

If it fails, the college will apply for the state construction funds on only the vocational-technical addition.

THE DEBATE between board members centered on the Fine Arts Building and whether it should be constructed before any other buildings on the campus.

However, they were told that if the millage fails, the college will not have enough funds to construct the building and purchase temporary classrooms that will be needed in 1972.

The money used to purchase temporary space and construct the vocational-technical addition if the millage fails will come from the \$1 million that is available from a 1968 bond issue.
