Annual School Report

Annual meeting was called to order at 8:25 p. m. by the President, Charles Erwin. The Secretary's report of 1935 was read by the Secretary. Motion made by Mrs. Rubert, supported by Mr. Smith, that the Secretary's report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was read. Motion made by Mrs. Schoenberg, supported by Mr. Werschen that the Treasurer's report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

The following tellers were appointed: Mr. Christmas, Mrs. McCullough and Mr. Werschen.

Nominations were open for members for three year term for president. Mr. Erwin nominated by Mr. Smith, supported by Mrs. Rubert. Mr. Newman nominated by Mrs. Vanderberg, supported by Mrs. Pink. Motion by Mr. Werschen supported by Mr. Smith that nominations be closed. Ballots cast 34. Mr. Erwin 21. Mr. Newman 13.

Nominations were again open for a three year term to fill vacancy for secretary. Miss Noble nominated by Mrs. Rubert, supported by Mr. McCullough. Mr. Christmas was nominated by Mr. Wilkinson, supported by Mrs. Schoenberg. Motion by Mr. Smith, supported by Mr. Werschen that the nominations be closed. Carried.

Motion by Werschen that Mr. Christmas be removed as teller and Mr. Newman take his place, supported by Mrs. Schoenberg. Ballots were again spread, collected, and counted by the tellers. There were 36 ballots cast. Miss Noble 26; Mr. Christmas 10.

Nominations were again open for one year term. Miss Noble nominated Mr. Smith, supported by Mr. McCullough. Mr. Wilkinson nominated Mrs. Schoenberg who declined. Mr. Werschen was nominated and declined. Mr. Werschen moved that Mr. Smith be unanimously elected, supported by Mr. Christmas. All years except Mr. Wilkinson.

Motion by Mr. Werschen that the School District pay the full tuition based on Farmington rates, supported by Mrs. Schoenberg. The chairman called for a rising vote. 30 stood; 6 not voting.

Motion by Mr. Smith supported by Mr. Werschen that we have a ten months school—carried.

Motion by Mrs. Christmas that five trees that were dead be cut down and put in the basement to be used as fuel, supported by Mr. Christmas—carried.

Motion to adjourn by Mr. McCullough, supported by Mr. Smith. Meeting adjourned at 9:25.
