DiPonio Arrested, Charged With Bribery

The arrests of Oakland County Drain Commissioner David W. Barry and his former deputy, James R. Nichols, last week were followed Monday by the grand jury indictment of Livonia contractor Angelo DiPonio on two counts, bribery and conspiracy to bribe. The indictment is the latest in a series of charges brought by the grand jury following a seven-month probe of the drain commission.

DiPonio, who resides at 8262 N. Territorial Rd., Plymouth, and is president of Greenfield Construction Co., Livonia, allegedly unlawfully gave certain gifts and gratuities to Barry and Nichols in 1967. The alleged gifts were two cashier checks, one to Barry in the amount of \$5,200 and one to Nichols for \$5,405. The money, "interest-free loans," went to the purchase of two new Buicks, Barry and Nichols have admitted.

Also indicted was Daryl Schuler, 6795 Lingor Drive, Clarkston, for aiding and abetting in the misuse of public funds. The grand jury specifically charged DiPonio with "corrupt intent to influence the decision on the Hamlin Drain contract, between the Nichols relief drainage district and the Greenfield Construction Co."

Both were arraigned before Oakland County Circuit Judges Clark J. Adams and William R. Beasley and released on personal bonds ranging from \$500 to \$5,000 on various charges. Thornton and Texeria were arraigned before Judge Adams and released on \$1,000 personal bond each.

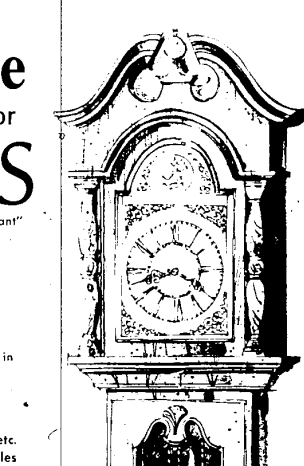
