Festival Pet Show Scheduled July 30

FARMINGTON One of the most popular events in the Farmington Founders Festival for children is the Festival pet show sponsored annually by the Farmington Plaza Merchants Association.

This year's pet show will be held Friday, July 30, at 3 p.m. at the Plaza Shopping Center at Grand River and Mooney.

THERE ARE ten categories of competition with trophies being given each winner. Trophies are on display at the Pets 'N' Particulars shop across from the Plaza center.

Entry forms must be submitted to Pets 'N' Particulars by 6 p.m. Thursday, July 29. Age limit for con-

testants is 14 years or younger.

Each contestant may enter only one category in the show.

However, another member of a family may enter the same pet in a different category using a separate entry blank.

All contestants will be given a handsome certificate of participation whether they win or not.

Among the categories of competition are: the pet with the most spots; pet with longest ears; shaggiest pet; most unusual pet and largest pet.

The competition also includes: The Twin Class, two most evenly matched pets; best trick, 30 seconds to perform; smallest pet, full grown (no insects); most original costume - pet and owner; and waggiest tail.

Trophies will be awarded to the first, second and third

place winners in each category. First place winners will compete for "The Best Pet in the Show" trophy.

Parents should not allow children to bring pets into the show ring that they cannot control because the contestants must handle their own pets. Parents will not be allowed in the show ring.

2 Receive Skill Prizes

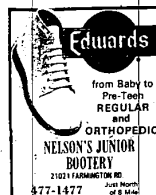

Dial MISS DIG On Excavations

The next digging project you or your neighbors begin will be made a lot easier thanks to a new service brought about by the combined efforts of three Oakland County cities, the county itself, and a group of public utilities.

The companies and municipalities have joined forces to operate a single telephone number through which any construction project, home or professional, can be finished with assurance that no one's gas, electricity or phone service will be the victim.

The procedure is simple — just call 647-7344, or "MISS DIG" for those with faulty memories or a preference for letters, and you get instant direction on where and how to dig.

The single telephone

number service began last Nov. 9, in a trial area in south Oakland County. Anyone who plans to dig should "call MISS DIG first," whether it's for a major office building or a backyard swimming pool, at least 24 hours in advance of their planned digging.

HERE'S HOW the new system works: When someone calls MISS DIG, a trained representative at the utility locate and protection service will take the details.

The information will be teletyped simultaneously to all participating in this cooperative effort. Should the utilities cities have service facilities in the area, their representative will locate and identify the location of the underground wires of pipes so the digger can avoid them.

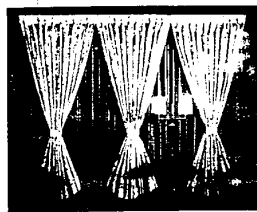
