

# Road Rally's Another Highlight Of Festival

For the second year in a row, a road rally will be held as part of the many activities during Farmington Founders Festival days.

The road rally will begin at noon Saturday, July 31, with between 50-60 cars leaving from Town 'N Country Dodge at 3015 Grand River.

Two to three hours later the rally will end with the winning cars reaching the finish line at Dunkel Junior High School on 12 Mile just east of Farmington Rd.

The rally has been organized by several rally clubs in southeastern Michigan and is being sponsored by the Farmington Founders Festival Committee, Rally Club of Michigan and Town 'N Country Dodge of Farmington. Russ Gilbert, proprietor.

The challenge of a rally is to run the prescribed course closest to the exact time set by the organizer. Instead of striving for top speed, the driver coming closest to the course time set wins - not necessarily the driver who crosses the finish line first.

The route will be through Farmington, Farmington Township and parts of southern Oakland County. Checkpoints will be established along the route by the rally clubs. The object is to go through the checkpoints in the exact amount of time set by the organizer.

Drivers receive points according to how far his times are off those set and the winner will be the driver with the fewest points. Trophies will be awarded the winners.

THE SHOW and sale will be open from 10-3 p.m. with a nominal \$1 admission fee charged.

A buffet luncheon table will be set up for service from noon to 8 p.m. for shoppers interested in lunching as they browse and buy. Girl Scouts will be available to care for young children on the grounds while parents see the show. The show is another project being undertaken to raise funds to operate the Farmington Community Center. All Farmington area residents are encouraged to attend with their friends, neighbors and relatives.

# Filling The Sky

Skydiving competition will again be staged during Festival days under the sponsorship of the Festival committee and the Elite Skydiving Club of Berkeley.

The skydiving event was added as a new event to the 1970 Festival and was so popular that it has returned for 1971.

The contest will be held Saturday, July 31, from 1-5 p.m. The landing area for the sky divers is the property on the southwest corner of 12 Mile and Farmington Rds.

The second annual Farmington Founders Festival Sky Diving Contest will have some 24 jumpers in two divisions vying for these prizes: \$100 first-place and \$50 for second in the advanced division; \$75 for first and \$50 for second in the intermediate division.

Winners are chosen on the basis of the accuracy of their jumps from an altitude of 3,000. If time allows, a free fall exhibition will be held from an altitude of 7,000 feet with all the winners of the competition participating.

The finale of the 1971 Farmington Founders Festival will be a Max Davey musical medley entitled "An Afternoon to Remember" sponsored by the Farmington Community Center on Sunday, Aug. 1, at 3:30 p.m.
