

Young Voters Can Register

FARMINGTON
Farmington residents who have not yet registered to vote, including newly franchised 18-21 year olds, may register during the Farmington Founders Festival July 29, 30, and 31.
The registrations during the Festival will not allow residents to vote in the Farmington Schools millage election Aug. 23. The deadline to register for the school

election passed yesterday, July 23.
Farmington Township officials, in cooperation with the West Bloomfield-Farmington Area League of Women Voters members, will be on hand Thursday and Friday, July 29 and 30, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. and on Saturday, July 31, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. to register those eligible.

This service is being offered especially for the 18 to 21-year-olds who are newly eligible to vote with ratification of the 26th Constitutional Amendment. Of course, anyone who has lived in the township at least 30 days and in the state six months may also avail themselves of this opportunity.

The League of Women Voter's booth will be located in front of the Secretary of State's office in the Downtown Farmington Center area.

war on abuse of what he calls T-A-D -- tobacco, alcohol, drugs.

He hopes they will attend the quarterly meetings of the full 20-member board of directors and the monthly meetings of the smaller executive board. He plans to advertise meeting dates and times so the community will know about them and attend. Potter said he wants to be "accountable for our actions and our expenditures in terms of significant feedback" to the community and to the agencies which fund the program.

Some people, for example, have the uneasy feeling that Rap Line harbors only a single small "clique" of the same young people.

Potter wants to check that out. "Is there turnover? How many kids are helped? Let's pin it down and let the people know," he said.

He also wants to drop the term "counselors" for the young people answering Rap Line calls from persons seeking assistance.

And he wants to set precise limitations on how far the young people can go in their telephoned advising.

IN HIS JOB as assistant principal, Potter said he always brings the parents in on serious problems such as drug use, pregnancy and the like and he feels the same should hold true for Rap Line. "We're going to operate Rap Line within the law and within the constitution," he said. The council has a "great group of people," he adds, in its board of directors -- from

city, township, police, schools, business and industry.

"We've got all this great group of people working together and we've put all our eggs in one basket, so to

speak, in attacking substance abuse. All the money has been put together into one pot. "Now let's lay it on the line, and let everybody know exactly what they're getting for their money."
