2 Scouts In Japan

FARMINGTON
Two Farmington scouts will
be in Japan Aug. 2-10 to attend
the 13th Boy Scouts World
Jamboree being held this year
at the foot of scenic Mount
Fuji.

The two local scouts
selected to make the trip are:
Michael P. Flesher of 28126
Harwich Dr., a member of
Troop 389; and James
Achtenberg of 28534
Westerleigh, member of
Troop 163.

They are among 7,000 U.S.
scouts and adult leaders in-
cluding 23 from the local
Clinton Valley Council who
will be joining 20,000 scouts
from 97 nations to carry out
the jamboree theme "For
Understanding."

This is the largest single
international scouting event
ever held and is the first in-
ternational jamboree ever
held in Asia.

American scouts will be
shuttled to Japan in a massive
airlift with 33 planes being
chartered for the 20-day trip
which will include sight-seeing
before and after the jamboree.

Clinton Valley scouts, in-
cluding Flesher and
Achtenberg, left Metropolitan
Airport on Saturday, July 31.
They will spend eight days
touring Japan at such places
as Tokyo, Nikko and Kyoto.
