The natives form a part of the Melanesian group of peoples, all of

Melanesian group of peoples, all of whom speak languages also known as Melanesian. These are funda-mentally related in a grammatical sense, but differ greatly in vocabu-

The Solomon Islanders are vigorous and wartike, but are compelled
to keep the peace except in the interior of one or two of the larger,
merry bead-hunters and contribula,
and often made raids on the in elighbors, using large high-built war canees 90 to 50 feet long, capable of
carrying 25 or more men. Clubs
and spears were the principal weapons, but bows and arrows were used
in some place.

The natives are of medium height,
but vary considerably. In the westtall, somewhat seproid, in appearnace, with kinkty, black hair and a
very dark or souty-black skin. The
castern islanders are somewhat
smaller, of a lighter, chocolatehorm, color, with curby or wary
hair. It is evident that in the Solomons, as in all other Melanestan islands, there is an underlying Oceanienegrod or Papuan type, mixed to a

Ferris Institute Starts Student Loan Fund



Long Distance Telephone Service Depends on Vacuum Tube Repeaters



Long distance telephone circuits are now carried from New York City to Dallas, Texas, in cables like the one shown in the center of this photograph, if repeaters, which depend on vacuum tubes, had not been invented to restore the attenuated voice currents at intervals along the line, such splace could not be used. Instead, conductors of enormous size, strung several feet apart on heavy pole lines, would be required for these long circuits. Tubes nearly two inches in diameter would be needed to carry across the continent the feeble voice currents generated by a telephone framsmitter, and there would have to be two of them, about like those shown beside the cable, for a simple circuit.
