At least 35 other school districts in Michigan are using the new social studies textbooks adopted for use in Farmington Schools next year.

A report by Larry Freedman, director of elementary education, presented to the Board of Education Tuesday listed nine districts using "The Social Sciences: Concepts and Values," published by Harcourt, Brace and Jovanovich; 24 using "The Laidlaw Social Science Program" put out by Laidlaw Brothers Publishing Co.; and five using "Investigating Man's World," published by Scott Foresman Co.

Districts using the texts included: Bloomfield Hills, Royal Oak, Clarkston, Clarkstonville, Detroit, Warren Woods, Gibraltar, Southfield, Warren Consolidated, Ann Arbor, Battle Creek, Crosswell, Dearborn, St. Paul Lutheran in Flint.

Also: Frankenmuth, Grosse Pointe, Hartford, Ionia, Kalamazoo, Lansing, Lodiington, Saginaw, Troy, Pontiac, Marshall, Warren, Warren Van Dyke, South Redford, St. Clair Shores, River Rouge, Wyandotte, Oak Park, and Trenton.

## 43 Entered Mini-Marathon

**FARMINGTON**  
One of the highlights of the 1971 Farmington Founders Festival was the Mini-Marathon foot race, a new event, held on July 31.

The race was an idea of Dr. Fred Weaver, a Farmington internist, who became sponsor for the event.

MANY of the planning details were handled by Jerry Young, Farmington High School cross-country coach, with assistance of his wife Jeanne who was secretary of the Festival committee.

The race was sanctioned by the Michigan AAU and consisted of a 10-mile course through Farmington Township and ending in the City of Farmington.

The race began at about 8:30 a.m. and the overall winner, Bill Keller of Lansing, pulled across the finish line 51 minutes, 46 seconds later.

Second to fifth place winners were: Duane Spitz, 51:52; Gary Pierson, 52:15; John Garza, 52:44; and Jay Kershbaum, 53:17.

A SECOND division of runners over 40 competed and winners from fifth through fifth were: Frank McBride, WSU athletic director, 57:05; Paul Hansen, 59:08; Chuck Davey, Michigan Boxing Commissioner, 59:44; Ernie MacDonald, 66:53; and Walt Long, 68:44.

The last runner to finish was a local jogger, Ed Cunningham, with a time of 86 minutes. Twenty-five trophies and medals were awarded to the first 15 finishers in the open event and ten finishers in the masters group.

There were 43 runners competing, 18 in the under 40 division and 22 in the over 40.

### Share's 10% For Paving

**FARMINGTON**  
A recent article in this newspaper, incorrectly reported that paving costs in Grand River Crest subdivision, Farmington Township, were being shared 50 per cent by homeowners and 25 per cent by both the county and township.

By policies adopted by the township and county road commission, each of the governmental units picks up 10 per cent of the cost with the property owners in the assessment district paying 80 per cent.

Both governments contributed \$27,904 to the project's total cost of \$276,045.
