***Evangelist
To Deaf
At Galilean***

Evangelist Eugene Kimmel, missionary to the deaf around the world with Baptist International Missions, Inc., will speak at the Galilean Baptist Church, 28875 W. Seven Mile, Livonia, Saturday, Aug. 7.

There will be a fellowship for all deaf persons of the Detroit area beginning with a carry-in dinner provided by the church's sign language class at 7 p.m. The film "Silent Witness," which is captioned for the deaf, will be presented at 8 o'clock.

Rev. Kimmel has been teaching the sign language class at Galilean for two weeks.

He instructs a class of two hours each morning and evening, during which he teaches about 750 words of the Galaudet Sign Language.

The Rev. Herbert Noel, pastor of the Galilean Baptist Church, invited all the deaf persons of the Detroit area to these services.

Beginning this Sunday there will be an interpreter for all services of the church.
