ART STUDENTS MAKE POSTERS FOR SENIOR PLAY

The large colored posters announcing the coming of the Senior class play, "Growing Pains", that are in several downtown stores windows are the result of a poster contest sponsored by the Seniors. Art students of the high school were the contestants; Grady McKay, Mary Lunny and Max Thompson, teachers, were the judges.

Contestants used all kinds of colors and ideas in their work and the judges had to deliberate long and long before they reached a decision.

The poster made by Richard Harms with a typical theater front at the bottom attracted most of their attention, and they awarded it first prize—two tickets to the play.

Theresa Himmelspach and the Greenman sisters received second and third prizes. Miss Himmelspach's poster was designed attractively in purple and gold, and the outstanding feature of the third prize poster was the wood block letters, "Growing Pains."

Plates For 1938 Take 1,500 Tons of Steel

Motor vehicles of the state will be carrying 1500 tons of Michigan steel in the form of license plates in 1938—an increase of about one-third over tonnage of previous years. The 10,000 gallons of enamel covering these plates weighs about 40 tons.

The increase purchase of Michigan steel and paint arises through decision of Leon D. Case, Secretary of State to substitute metal half-year permits for the windshield stickers of previous years. About one plate in three is a half-year permit. Stickers were purchased in previous years from an Illinois firm.

The 1937 legislature added a 25-cent fee to the cost of the half-year permits, to cover bookkeeping and other costs. Metal plates are made at the State Prison of Southern Michigan for about 11 cents a pair, and provide much-needed prison labor; the stickers cost about 4 cents each.

Township Man to Answer Three Charges March 18

Fred Wurster of Farmington Township will be examined in the municipal court March 18 before Judge John J. Schulte on charges of assault and battery, bastardy, and publishing obscene writing. Wurster, who was released on

\$1,000 bond, has plead, guilty to the first and third charges. He was arrested on the first two November 22 and on the third February 22.

William A. Kargetta of Farmington filed the complaint against Wurster on the obscene writing charge. He found a note on the door of his garage, he said.

A woman, the former wife of a Farmington man, filed the other two complaints. Wurster demanded examination on the charge of bastardy, claiming the father of the child, which is expected soon, is the woman's former husband.

Two Taken to Pontiac To Await Trial on Theft

Mike Wellekko and a 16-year old boy were taken by a State Trooper to Pontiac Wednesday where they will be held until March 18 when they will appear before Municipal Judge John J. Schulte in answer to charges filed by Herbert Vader Redford that they stole Vader's car in Southfield Township.

Vader said the car was stolen February 26. Wellekko and the boy Tuesday were brought before Judge Schulte who arraigned them on a \$1,000 bond. They plead not guilty. Wellekko was put in the Oakland County jail. The boy was taken to a detention home.

No Extension on Filing of Income Tax Returns

The Michigan Association of C. P. A.'s advises membership and clients of members that extensions of time for filing income tax returns due on or before March 15, 1938, will be difficult to obtain.

Every individual, partnership and corporation required to file an income tax return for the calendar year 1937 should use every possible effort to see that the return is filed on or before March 15, accompanied by not less than 25% of the tax due as shown by the income tax return.

The reason for this warning is that it is going to be difficult to secure from the Collector of Internal Revenue an extension of time for filing the Income Tax Return. The Collector has received instructions from the Commissioner at Washington to deny any and all requests for extensions of time, except in "the most unusual and/or meritorious cases."

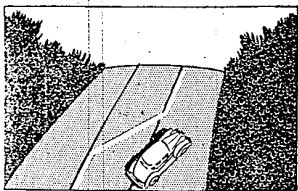

Teach Child Self Help College Instructor Says

Does your child wake at dawn and insist that the affairs of the household begin even if parents get to sleep?
That's an age old question which an assistant in child development and training at Michigan State College believes can be answered to better advantage than most parents answer it. The teaching of self care and responsibility and interest in things that a child can do without disturbing the entire household are involved.
At the age of four or even younger, says Ruth Wagner, a youngster can learn to help himself until the adults of the household get up for the day.
It's best to teach the idea as a surprise that will make the "hardy bird" happy to cooperate in this childhood adventure.
"If you have an early riser in your household, you'll find it worth your effort to work out such a plan," Miss Wagner says. "The system adds to convenience of tired sleepers and adds to the development of the child as well."

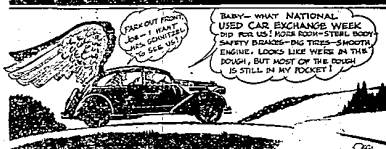
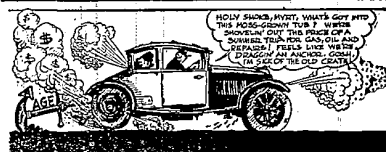
