Zoning, a long and complex procedure, as well as being a safety and health measure, gives residents of a given area security that the character of the area will not be changed.

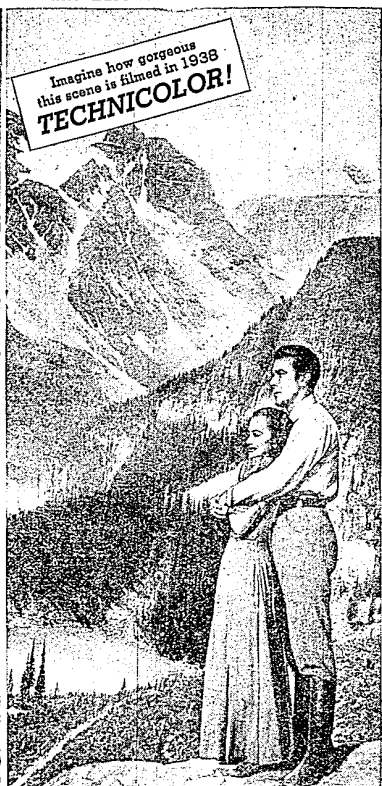
Paul Schreiber, head of the zoning committee, told the Commission he wrote to Senator Arthur Vandenberg asking him to have zoning information sent from various departments of the government. Mr. Schreiber said he also wrote to several cities and to State officials. Nearly all his sources of information told him one of the difficult aspects of drafting a zoning code is getting the right start. If a zoning committee makes a mistake in the beginning the whole job must be done over, Mr. Schreiber said.

To draft a code the committee must do two things—draw a map and "put the map into words." An important and difficult procedure is that the two cannot be done separately.
