

New Club Makes The Scene

A "young" club, run by youth for youth, is making the scene at St. Priscilla Catholic Church in Livonia.

Organized a year and a half ago, The Youth Action Club recently added to its action monthly "rap" sessions on current and important topics.

Rapping recently with Ken Kirkwood, probation officer of the 16th District Court, the kids got into such topics as crime and capital punishment, and use of drugs, marijuana and alcohol.

They've asked Kirkwood to return for another rap night Aug. 19, this time bringing with him a youthful drug addict, and they will take up the topic of abortion and premarital sex in another session Sept. 16.

ALSO SCHEDULED by the YAC are a rock mass on the theme of war at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 26, in St. Priscilla, located on Furlingbrook north of Seven Mile, a bowling and pizza party Sept. 11, a general meeting Sept. 13 and board meetings Aug. 23 and Sept. 27.

YAC officers include Denise Damon, chairman; Barry Elwell, treasurer; Sandra Subatek, publicity chairman; Tom Murdock, social activity chairman; and Sandy Hopkins, refreshment chairman. Adult advisers are Jean Co-Julca, Carol Huston and Connie Rodgers.

THE GROUP was organized, Miss Calaluca said, to give the young people of the church "a sense of belonging and freedom of expression and a voice in things that affect their lives."

"Our youth feels alienated

from his church, his country and sometimes his home," she said. "The purpose of the YAC is to integrate youth into every facet of community life."

The club, in its short

lifetime, has helped clean and paint a house for a woman on welfare, has "adopted" with financial support a leper child in a mission in Burma, made contributions to Open City and contributed Christmas

presenters for disturbed children. On the social side, YAC members have had ski trips, dances, picnics and baseball games, and between times they have staged car washes,

bake sales and contests to raise funds for both service and social projects. Miss Calaluca said, give the kids "an opportunity for frank and honest discussion on topics that are current and important to them without fear of adults interring or inhibiting them."

Ideas flowed freely in the first session, she reported.

For example, in the consideration of capital punishment, she said the feeling was expressed that "two wrongs do not make a right—if a man commits murder it will not rectify his crime to take his life."

She added that some of the kids seemed to feel that parents may push their offspring into criminal acts by "keeping them too busy with activities but not paying real attention to them."

THIS ADVISER said she felt groups of this sort should be strictly youth-run, but that adult leaders can be of service in helping young people clarify their own feelings.

In the rap session, she said, the participants all opposed violence, but found it hard to equate the bombing of Federal buildings with the violence of war.

"They also argued that marijuana be legalized because alcohol does just as much damage and it's legal," Miss Calaluca said. "Then they could only laugh when we threw back their own argument that 'two wrongs don't make a right.'"

Rev. Lester Kinsolving's Religion Update

President Nixon's announced intention to visit mainland China may have electrified the world—but it has outraged one of his fellow Republicans in the California State Legislature, the Rev. E. Richard Barnes of San Diego. The Rev. and Hon. Mr. Barnes has bitterly denounced the president for what he calls "foolishness with Mao Tse Tung and Chou En Lai." He has also distributed what may be the most transparent example of "sermonic prayer" in recent ecclesiastical history: "Forbid that we, facing mortal danger from a cunning, ruthless, God-hating enemy, should be so soft, so pleasure-loving, so apathetic, so complacent, so selfish, so indifferent, so irresponsible, so irreligious, so confused and so timid as to lose for ourselves and our children this last, best hope on earth..."

LEGISLATOR BARNES goes on (at considerable length) to utilize Kipling as well as Washington at Valley Forge in asking that "we and our leaders bow the knees of our hearts (sic) before Thee every day," so that "laughter once more returns to children's lips."

Laughter has often emanated from the lips of children (and adults too) who know about Barnes' astounding public record—which is preserved, among other places, in the back files of the strongly conservative newspaper, The San Diego Union.

One Sacramento newspaper found it hard to laugh, however, when in 1962 he was apprehended for falsifying his name in borrowing and keeping overtime a library book, "The Dictionary of American Slang" (which Barnes once compared to heroin). The youth confessed to his school principal, Albert Sessarango, that the Rev. and Hon. Mr. Barnes had told him to pretend the book (which Barnes was using) was lost.

BARNES DENIED these charges, which were brought to the attention of the district attorney and informed inquiring reporters: "I am fighting for the decency of the American home, the mothers, the fathers and the children who are being drenched with the flood of filth now prevalent in this state!"

He subsequently took a lead in sponsoring an anti-pornography referendum ("The CLEAN Amendment") which was so fantastic that it was opposed by practically every district attorney in the state and denied endorsement even by Los Angeles arch-conservative James Francis Cardinal McIntyre.

When during this campaign there appeared widely distributed mimeographed lists of carefully excerpted words from "The Dictionary of American Slang," publisher (now columnist) Tom Braden inquired: "How did he know which words to pick?"

AMONG OTHER THINGS, the Rev. and Hon. Mr. Barnes has:

• Vehemently defended both the John Birch Society and the American Committee to Free Cuba (which charged the late President John F. Kennedy with aid and comfort to the enemy);

• Introduced legislation designed to restrict the

teaching of the theory of evolution in California's public schools—a measure described by 25 faculty members of San Diego City College as "The Barnes, Monkey Bill."

• Been a leader in campaigning for the Liberty Amendment, a pet project of the far right—as well as an area leader of Dr. Fred Schwartz' Christian Anti-Communist Crusade, which subsequently fell from fame to minuscule as appearing among those for acne and hemorrhoids.

BARNES was originally a Methodist, prior to becoming a Baptist—in to the near-haphazard delight of Los Angeles' famed Methodist Bishop, Gerald Kennedy.

But he seems almost eternally entrenched in his strongly conservative district in suburban San Diego, despite recurrent opposition, for a desk job. He receives full Navy pay by claiming he is totally disabled—and full legislator's pay by claiming he is vigorous. Yet he claims to oppose welfare frauds!

He therefore seems hardly probable that China's 800 million people will be deprived of a U.S. presidential visit because of the protests of such a person as the Rev. and Hon. Mr. Barnes to his fellow Republican up the beach in San Clemente.
