Money payments now due in Michigan under the Social Security Act are averaging \$69.28 for each claimant against the U. S. average of \$64.96, according to Walter B. Redman, manager of the Social Security field office in the Peoples State Bank Building in Pontiac. Latest figures show the average payment now is the largest since the Social Security Act went into operation.

All services of the Pontiac field office of the Social Security Board are given without charge, it was said today by the manager, Mr. Walter B. Redman. Mr. Redman declared his office files claims and gives all other services without cost or fees of any kind. He advised that it is not necessary to engage an expert to assist in the filing of applications for claims or to receive any other service given under the social security office insurance plan.

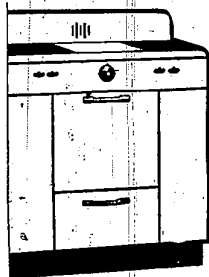

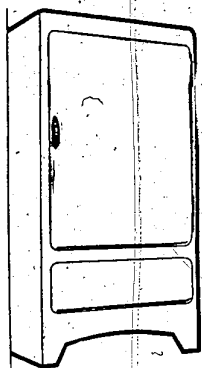

WHO WROTE IT?

"On A Sunday Afternoon"



HE has been writing songs for forty years, beginning with that period when he sold his first published song for fifteen dollars outright, and saw it reach a public reception of more than two million copies. This was "My Old New Hampshire Home" written long before America's songwriters had organized the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers, of which he is a member.

He was born in Detroit in 1898, and ran away from home at fourteen to join a circus. By sixteen, he had become a seasoned actor, as well as composer and singer of original songs. He came to New York in 1922 as groom to a carload of horses. He had \$1.45 in his pocket. His songwriting career may be said to have been born in Tony Pastor's music hall; and out of the years have come such songs as "Wait 'Till The Sun Shines, Nellie," "Down Where The Warburgers Grow," "When The Harvest Days Are Over, Jessie Dear," "I'd Leave My Happy Home For You," "Last Night Was The End Of The World," "On The Old Fall River Line," "Take Me Back To New York Town," etc. etc. Blanche Ring first sang "On A Sunday Afternoon."

Later the composer turned publisher, and claims credit for having published the first songs of George Gershwin and Irving Berlin.
