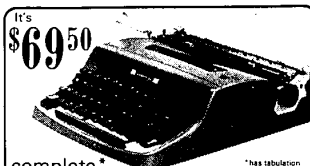

Austin Praises License-By-Mail

Charles Deamud, manager of the Secretary of State office in Redford, played an important role in the recently announced sales-by-mail of Michigan license plates.

Richard H. Austin, Michigan's secretary of state, told the Redford Chamber of Commerce Wednesday that Deamud was involved in new discussions of the new operation.

"Although his future was in doubt, Deamud was impartial in the discussions," Austin said.

"He was instrumental in getting the views on the program from office managers throughout the state," the secretary added.

DEAMUD, COMMENTING on the new program, said he believed it would only cut branch office volume by seven to 10 per cent.

"I can't see where it will affect our office personally. We started as a small office 11 years ago and have grown to one of the largest in the state."

He said being able to purchase license plates by mail will be of great benefit for persons in small communities who are far from a Secretary of State office.

"These people will really appreciate this new plan," Deamud said. "Some of those

up north had to drive 30 to 40 miles just to buy a license plate."

Deamud pointed out that buying by mail is only available until Jan. 1.

"Those who don't have their plates by that time, we have to make a trip to a branch office," he added.

THE NEW MAIL operation, which will begin this fall, will tie in with an agreement with the State Civil Service Commission which provides for a gradual transfer of the remaining licensing operations, where feasible, to combination civil service operated driver and auto license offices.

"With the cooperation of the Civil Service Commission, and the branch managers, we have successfully ended an eight-year search for a plan to achieve greater efficiency and economy in the administration of our licensing functions," Austin pointed out.

"At the same time, the plan will help make the purchase of auto licenses more convenient for Michigan's auto owners."

AUSTIN TOLD the Chamber members that he was jokingly informed, when he took office, that the secretary of state has more to do than select the color of license plates.

"I have found this is certainly true," he said.

He said there are more than 2,000 employees in his department.

"We sell over five million license plates a year and collect over \$300 million in state tax dollars."

His office has over five million car registrations on file and some six million driver records.

"We are now in the process of buying 1973 license plates," he explained.

"We have a computer which can search these six million driving records and give an answer in a minute. We will soon have another computer which will give immediate access to automobile titles."

The secretary said these were just a few of the activities his office is involved with, "in addition to selecting the color of license plates."

\$3 Million Job Fund For Oakland

Oakland County will apply for \$3 million available under the Federal Emergency Employment Act to put the county's unemployed on the public payroll for one year.
